



2021 Street Rehabilitation Project

Construction Update

September 2, 2022

Current Events:

It is anticipated that North Valley Inc., the City's Street Project Contractor, will begin moving onsite next week (Approximately Wednesday – September 7th). The contractor will begin mobilizing onsite, installing traffic and erosion control and begin removals of existing curb & gutter. The project isn't replacing all the curb & gutter and will only replace spot curb & gutter in areas where the curb & gutter is broken, settled or is causing drainage issues. If the curb & gutter in front of your driveway is selected as being replaced, there may be a portion of your driveway that will need to be removed and replaced with the removal/installation of the curb & gutter near your driveway.

The City will send additional notices as the work commences. Future project updates will be more specific and will provide important dates. Residents can anticipate a weekly update during construction, typically posted on Friday afternoon. Note work will be phased by the contractor, with substantial completion anticipated to be in October.

Resident Access

Residents will have access to their driveways during construction except when major construction events are occurring on their street. The City and Contractor will collaborate in minimizing the inconvenience to residents during construction. Please keep in mind that this type of construction may generate noise, dust and mud. Street construction can be disruptive to the neighborhood, please be patient with the contractor and contact us if you have concerns we can help with.

Worksite Safety

Although it is tempting and interesting to watch, it is very important that residents, including children, remain out of the immediate work zone. Please remember to be safe and drive cautiously wherever you see construction workers, equipment and warning signs.

The contractor's hours will be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday – Friday. There is potential for occasional work on Saturdays upon City approval. Additionally, the project covers a large area (1.8 miles). There may be times when you will not see continuous construction activity on your street. The contractor is likely in another area of the project.
